STATUTORY INSTRUMENT

No. 71 of 1998

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 15 of the Pesticides Control Act, Chapter 181B of the Laws of Belize, Revised Edition 1980-1990, and all other powers thereunto him enabling.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the

Short title.

PESTICIDES CONTROL (SALE AND CONFISCATION) REGULATIONS, 1998

2.(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

Interpretation.

"Act" means the Pesticide Control Act:

CAP. 181B.

"product" means the pesticide in the form in which it is packaged or sold,

"sale" includes offering a product for sale;

"register of sales," means a register used for entering the particulars of sales of restricted pesticides.

(2) Words and expressions used in these Regulations and not defined herein but defined in the Act, shall have the meaning respectively assigned to them in the Act.

Conditions for the sale of pesticides S.I. 77/1995. 3. (1) Only pesticides duly registered in Belize under the Registered and Restricted Pesticides (Registration) Regulations, 1995, shall be sold in Belize.

(2) Every establishment registered for sale of restricted pesticides in accordance with the Registered and Restricted Pesticides (Manufacture, Import and Sale) Regulations, 1998, shall have a manager who shall be responsible for the pesticides kept in the establishment.

(3) The manager specified in sub regulation (2) above shall be in possession of a certified user's licence issued by the Board under the Restricted Pesticides (Certified User) Regulations, 1996:

Provided that any person may present to the Board evidence of another qualification, which the Board at its discretion may deem equivalent to the certified user's licence. For the purpose of such qualification the Board shall provide certification of its equivalency and it shall thereafter be deemed to be certified user's licence.

Conditions for licensing of establishments selling restricted pesticides.

- 4. (1) Every establishment desirous of selling restricted pesticides shall make an application for registration of premises to the Board in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.
- (2) On receipt of an application for registration to sell restricted pesticides, an inspector of the Board shall carry out an inspection of the premises and shall assess the fitness of the establishment to sell restricted pesticides and thereafter tender his report to the Board.
- (3) On receipt of an inspector's report, the Board shall determine whether the establishment meets the requirements set out in the First Schedule hereto and may –

First Schedule.

- (a) grant a licence, or
- (b) require remedial action to improve the fitness of the establishment before making a further consideration for the issue of a licence, or
- (c) refuse to issue a licence, stating the reasons for the refusal.
- (4) The Board may at any time after a licence has been issued, inspect an establishment selling restricted pesticides, and if the establishment no longer meets the requirements set out in the First Schedule hereto, the Board may suspend the licence until such time as the requirements are met.

First Schedule.

5. (1) Establishments licensed to sell restricted pesticides shall keep a register of sales of restricted pesticides, to include name and address of the certified pesticides user, Certified pesticide User's licence number, name(s) and amount(s) of the restricted pesticide(s) purchased and date of purchase. The register of sales shall be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

Second Schedule.

- (2) Only persons in possession of certified pesticides user's licence shall purchase restricted pesticides at licensed establishments and the manager of each establishment shall ensure that the purchaser holds a certified pesticides user's licence before making any sale of a restricted pesticide.
- 6. Establishments selling restricted pesticides shall have a separate room containing the following: -

Premises to have sanitary facilities.

- (a) proper protective clothing for workers;
- (b) shower bath;
- (c) sanitary service and a wash basin; and

(d) first aid medical cabinet.

Pesticides may be confiscated.

- 7. A pesticide may be confiscated by an inspector of the Board if: -
 - (a) it does not comply with the chemical, physical, or biological properties declared in the registration of the product or if it is found to be adulterated on analysis at an approved laboratory;
 - (b) it has not been registered with the Board;
 - (c) it is repackaged or formulated without the authorization of the Board;
 - (d) it is improperly labeled or packaged contrary to the provisions of the Registered and Restricted Pesticides (Registration) Regulations; or

(e) it has been imported illegally or the appropriate fees under the Registered and Restricted Pesticides (Manufacture, Import and Sale) Regulations have not been paid in

respect of the pesticide.

Pesticide may be retained for analysis or as an

8. An inspector of the Board may retain samples of a pesticide pending the results of analysis to determine the identity, physical, chemical, and biological condition of the pesticide and may also; following receipting; submit samples of the pesticide as an exhibit in any legal proceedings.

Confiscation form Third Schedule.

9. Any pesticide, which has been confiscated, will be documented in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto. Three such forms will be done, one copy will remain with the establishment, and two copies will remain with the Board pending any legal proceedings.

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10. An owner of a pesticide confiscated under these Regulations may, if dissatisfied with the confiscation, lodge an appeal with the Board within 15 days of the confiscation.

Appeals.

11. After a period of 90 days from the date the appeal was lodged, the Board shall proceed to hear and determine the appeal. The Board may –

Appeals to be heard.

- (a) allow the appeal and return the pesticide to the person from whom it was confiscated; or
- (b) dispose of the pesticide without compensation to the owner after dismissing the appeal.
- 12. Any person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Offence and penalties.
